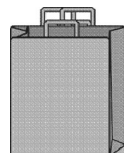

Lent Is Here!



As we begin our journey through Lent, please take the opportunity to pray and prepare for Easter. In Church we have Rice Bowls for you to take and use at home. The idea is that you have a smaller more simple meal once (or more) a week. The extra money you might have spent on a more elaborate meal goes in your Rice Bowl. This will be donated to assist people trying to raise their own food and make themselves self-sustainable. These donations make a huge difference! Keep your Rice Bowl in the middle of your dining table so that you will remember to say a prayer for those who do not have enough to eat.

Another way to fully participate in the Lenten experience is to read and pray over a Little Black Book. There are books in church, and you are welcome to take one home. This prayer form is perfect for busy people. It only takes 6 minutes a day. There is a short Scripture passage on one page and a short reflection or educational piece on the facing page. These short stories are often entertaining as well as educational. You can do this alone or meet with friends and read and discuss the passages together. We are sure that it will deepen your Lenten experience!



Don't forget to come on the Fridays of Lent at 6pm for adoration, followed by the Stations of the Cross.
