From the Mind and Heart of Deacon Chris.....

Awhile back I was golfing with a foursome and we were teeing off at one of the holes. Normal golf etiquette is that you don't talk while someone is teeing off and you watch where the other person's ball goes. The person in front of me teed off and hit a bad shot. He then walked over to a tree and smacked his golf driver into the tree as hard as he could yelling a profanity. Essentially, he wrapped his driver around the tree ruining his club. I was up to hit next and I wasn't sure what to do. So, I just went up and hit. Well, none of us said anything, and if I was going to say something, I wasn't sure what to say.

I don't know about you but I think I see unchecked anger more today in our society than at any time in the past. What are some of us angry about? The clerk at the store tells someone they have to wear a face mask to come into the store; customer goes ballistic. From the local news; somebody cut someone else off on I-94, a minute later there're gunshots fired on the freeway and police are looking for shell casings. We call that Road Rage. Road Rage is a term that even made it into our dictionary: It's -- 'violent anger caused by the stress and frustration

involved in driving a motor vehicle in difficult conditions'. No one ever heard of 'Road Rage' before the 90'S. You recall the last presidential campaign, it was anything but cordial, and stirring up anger was frequently noted from the White House. I recall seeing this video on election night. Some people felt that the count wasn't going right at the TCF Center in Detroit, and they were yelling, screaming, pounding on the glass. And then there was the violent assault on the US Capitol on January 6 th ;on the Feast of the Epiphany! What happened about being reasonable adults?

Why is there such anger? Psychologists give a variety of reasons: People feel they've been cheated, disrespected, feel powerless, mad, frustrated, and hopeless; the list goes on. But how about when and why angry is felt? I don't know about you, but when I saw the video of the

police officer in Minneapolis kneeing on George Floyd's neck and yes, killing him. I was so angry; so mad. That was wrong. We could say that I was experiencing justifiable angry? Sure, in the Gospels there is the 'Cleansing of the Temple'. This scene occurs is in all four Gospels where Jesus expels the merchants and money changers from the Temple, accusing them of turning the Temple into a 'den of thieves' by their commercial activities. Jesus tells Peter to 'Get behind

me Satan!' and called Pharisees 'White washed Tombs'. Yes, we could call this a justifiable anger.

Psychologists also tell usthough any type of anger over time is inherently unhealthy, it robs us of our peace of mind and causes suffering within. Feeling angry on a regular basis for any reason only hurts oneself in the long run.

Anger management can be tough. We all have said things in anger that we've regretted and done things in anger that we've also regretted. So how do we control anger? I read something interesting on controlling vices like anger from St John of the Cross. According to St John of the Cross it can be hard to root out a vice or a bad habit (like anger) by attacking it directly. An alternative strategy might be to focus on what is good in our lives so that they 'burn out' the bad habit or vice. We have a young friend who frequently says, 'Just, go to the good!'

And what is the opposite of anger? Generosity, love, kindness and patience. So to combat anger, focus on those virtues. The more one grows in generosity, love, kindness and patience; the less room they have in their hearts for anger or resentment. In the Book of Proverbs there is a verse that I like and this summarizes it -- Hatred stirs up disputes, but love covers all offenses. (10:12) So, what ever happened with the person who smashed his driver in the tree? I don't know, he was a sub and I never saw him again. I do pray though that somehow he has learned to control his anger.


What to Wear/Bring:
