What is the Greatest Miracle on Earth?

What is the greatest miracle on earth? For example, some might think the earth itself and all that is in it, is the greatest miracle.

Perhaps the accounts in the Old Testament that God the Father accomplished through Prophets like Abraham, Moses, Isaiah, Joshua, Elijah, Jeremiah, Elisha, Miriam, David, Daniel, and others make up the greatest miracle. Some might think the miracles performed by Jesus documented in the Bible are the greatest miracles. Like the time when Jesus cured the blind man at Bethsaida *Mark 8:22-25* which states, "And they came to Bethsaida. And some people brought to him a blind

man, and begged him to touch him. And he took the blind man by the hand, and led him out of the village; and when he had spit on his eyes and laid his hands upon him, he asked him, "Do you see anything? "And he looked up and said, "I see men; but they look like trees, walking." Then again, he laid his hands upon his eyes; and he looked intently and was restored, and saw everything clearly. Another great miracle was the woman who bled for many years in *Mark* 5:25-34 that states, "And there was a woman who had had a flow of blood for twelve years, and who had suffered much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was no better but rather grew worse. She had heard the reports about Jesus, and came up behind him in

the crowd and touched his garment. For

she said, "If I touch even his garments, I

shall be made well." And immediately the

hemorrhage ceased; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. And Jesus, perceiving in himself that power had gone forth from him, immediately turned about in the crowd, and said, "Who touched my garments?" And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing around you,



and yet you say, 'Who touched me?'" And he looked around to see who had done it. But the woman, knowing what had been done to her, came in fear and trembling and fell down before him, and told him the whole truth. And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."

I could go on and on with many miracles of God the Father and Jesus, I suggest to you that the greatest miracle on earth_today is the work of the Holy Spirit through the hands of a Priest, <u>The Eucharist</u>, which Jesus told us humans about in *John 6:51-58*, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, 'How can this man give us [His] flesh to eat?' Jesus said to them, 'Amen, amen, I

say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me

and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."

I like many followers of Jesus believe *The Eucharist* is the greatest miracle on earth because Jesus said so, at the last supper, *Mark 14:22-24* "While they were eating. He took

bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, and said, 'Take it; this is my body.' Then He took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, This **is** my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Like the Prophets in the Old Testament and the faithful folks cured by Jesus because of their faith and the grace of God, given the above scripture, the miracle of *The* Eucharist or Jesus giving us His flesh and His blood in an unbloody manner is the greatest miracle on earth!
